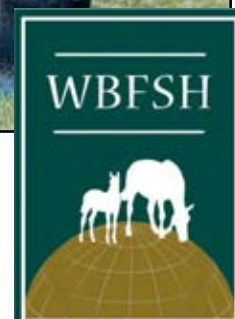

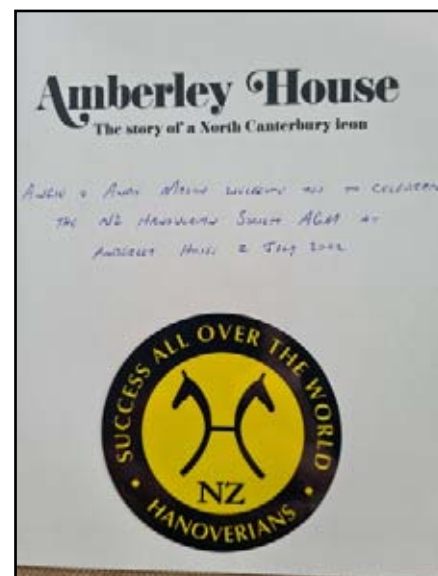
Lunch was served to oohs and aghs and immensely enjoyed. The garden/stable walk that followed was a relaxing and convivial preamble to the AGM itself. Three

Two prominent members of The New Zealand Hanoverian Society died recently.

Sara Williams was one of the foundation members of the society. From 1977 when we first began she rarely missed a meeting. Nick Williams, an international dressage judge and our second president, always referred to her as Cousin Sara. They were part of the well known Williams Family from Wairoa.

For twelve years Sara was secretary and then treasurer of our society and stud book keeper for ten years. In those days everything was written in long hand. She had an extensive knowledge of New Zealand thoroughbreds and their bloodlines, which was important because Hanoverian classified thoroughbreds were our foundation brood mares.

Two of Sara's broodmares were by Witzbold, and she was an ardent supporter of Anamour. The last foal she bred was Archie (Anamour/Dynamit), now ridden at advanced dressage level by Betty Brown.

Sara was a life member of our society.

Berny Maubach was also an active member.

He was president of the society from 1988 until 1993, when the combined society split into the present two independent societies.

Berny was briefly a supporter of the Cleveland Bay breed of horses and then became interested in the Hanoverian breed when Distelfink arrived in the country. He imported Dynamit, a registered and licensed Hanoverian stallion.

Berny, who was a former German police officer, lived near Wanganui. He loved his horses and made a special burial ground for his beloved stallions where his own ashes are now scattered.

THE VERBAND TOUR 2023 - WELCOME TO MAREN SCHLENDER



Hanoverian and Rheinland Studbook Tour February 2023

It is with great pleasure that we announce that after a 2-year absence, we have a tour booked for February 10th - 20th 2023. Our Verband visitor will be Maren Schlender - Deputy Breeding Manager of Hannoveraner eV. and Head of Breeding Overseas.

We have a very busy schedule in place already and unfortunately, we will not be able to cover the whole country - so here are the areas we can cover -

Auckland, Waikato/Rotorua/Taupo, Wellington/Central Districts and Kapiti Coast, Christchurch/Canterbury, North and South, Hawkes Bay and Northland.

There will be Mare classifications, Stallion licensing Mare Families (Dam and 2 female progeny) and Foal Assessments available.

We have a list of mares already in place - and are asking for further expressions of interest from both current and new breeders alike.

Maren Schlender has been working at the Hannoveraner Verband since 2008 and has been Deputy Breeding Director since the end of 2019. At the beginning of 2022, she took over the management of the International Breeding Department at the Verband from Dr. Ludwig Christmann and continues some of his previous activities for the association. This includes above all the support of foreign breeders, as well as the cooperation with the daughter societies.

In addition to many judging activities at mare shows and mare performance tests in Germany, registration tours in Europe and overseas are on the agenda in summer and fall.

We will announce the process for the Foal Assessments in the late spring. There may be a need for you to travel to a venue if you are in an isolated area away from the general tour arrangements.



Maren grew up on a farm and studied agricultural science. As a young girl, she participated in young breeder competitions and rode horses on the side. As a Verband youth spokesperson and trainer of the Hanoverian Young Breeders Team, she got to know the association work in the Hannoveraner Verband and started working as an assistant to the breeding director after her studies.

President's Report - Judith Matthews

Judith Mathews read her president's report which is contained below:

Well in spite of the country being in lockdown and having no German visitor/Inspector we have had a successful year. Our two classifiers have had a busy time covering the country inspecting mares and encouraging new members and existing members. They inspected a total of 56 new mares, so now the total of active mares including these ones is 172. We have had 113 foals recorded and hopefully branded, with a bigger total due in the coming season.

There weren't many Shows held in the upper north island, but lower north and the south were not so badly affected. But in spite of this there have been 52 awards processed. These include the results of the 25 foals presented for the Virtual assessments sent to Germany for assessing. I must say after doing two it is hard work to get the foals to do what is required. And thank you to the team getting the videos prepared and sent. We got good results as seen in the awards presentations.

The North Island Championships was about the biggest Show this season, and there were 40 plus Hanoverian and Rheinland horses entered. From that came 15 Champions or Reserve Champions and many in the top 5 finish. So we should be proud of our breeders and I congratulate them on the successes. Look forward to many more of these Champions being bred.

We seem to be able to breed horses with the paces and talent to compete and the temperament has improved so much since the old days of the Witzbold type stallions. Was scary going out on some of those horses I must say. We have booked flights for a German inspector next year, in February_2023 Maren Schlender

who is the Deputy Breeding manager in the Hanoveraner Verband is coming on the inspection Tour, so that will be interesting, we haven't had a lady before. Looking forward to it.



Financial Summary - Julianne Flyger

Summary of Financial Statement for end of year - May 2022

The 2022 year consisted of a profit of \$9,521.57 compared to a profit of \$7,576 in 2021. Most of our income came from the studbook, DNA and membership dues.

There was no German tour again this year due to covid so the tour expenses remained consistent with previous year as once again Angela and Robin conducted a NZ tour.

We have database subscription fees now with the new database that we did not have last year. This is a yearly ongoing expense now.

DNA expenses are our largest which are recuperated back in DNA Income.

The Verband fees are less this year as we are up to date and this is the yearly fee, last year we paid 3 years' worth in the year.

This year we have accounts receivable of \$6,045.93 which has since decreased to 4k.

Overall, we are in another good position financially at year end.

Adele White – Breeding Manager of the NZ Performance Horses based in Hastings at that operates out of the famous Hawkes Bay Okawa Stud farm on the Taihape road. Adele is a walking encyclopedia when it comes to jumping bred pedigrees, especially those of the many mares in the NZPH herd there.

Adele grew up in Hawke's Bay, she has been with NZPH for 20 years, becoming Breeding Manager of NZPH in 2014. She is one of the leading practitioners of artificial insemination of horses in New Zealand, typically inseminating 35-40 mares each year and achieving a 75-80% success rate. Adele has experience working in a breeding barn in Virginia, USA where she returns annually to work their season and keep up to date with international trends and developments in her field. Adele has her own business A1 Reproduction Services and AI's outside mares

Angie Mason – Stallion owner, rider and breeder from Amberley in North Canterbury (and hostess to our very successful 2022 AGM) She and her husband Andrew own the beautiful Amberley House and Stud farms at Amberley and in the Culverden hill country (both for horses, cattle and crops)

Amberley House has a strong equestrian tradition, established with the Amberley House School in the 1920s (whose motto was Semper Fidelis) and continued through the development of the original horse breeding operation in the 1940s, which produced Auckland Cup and Trentham Stakes winner, Sailing Home.

Amberley House owners, the Mason family, have re-established the historic property's horse breeding operation with the refurbishment of the stables, yards and training areas, and introduction of significant new warmblood bloodlines. Angie and Andy Mason have a passion for breeding quality sport horses, with the ideal looks, temperament and trainability to become truly outstanding.

Janelle Sangster-Ward – breeder, successful rider, graduate of Lincoln University, wife and mother -who hails from Ward in Marlborough but now resides in Ohoka, North Canterbury. Her family's boutique breeding business SW Equestrian is run in conjunction with her Mum, Helen Sangster out of their beautiful vineyard and farm in Ward. Janelle was very successful on the now deceased Rheinland studbook mare, SWE Roulette (Ramirez Holst/Sir Bart xx) that represented NZ in Prix St Georges level in a Trans-Tasman team in Australia. Her current star is SWE Baloo, out of SWE Roulette and by Buckingham KWPN.

Of the 115 foals added to my spread sheet, Hann 70, Rhein 39, St Bk II 6 – there has been 75% completion of paperwork. There are the usual stragglers, and I will find time to do yet another follow up message to them. I sent 17 emails in early July and from that 11 have been completed or partially completed.

I also sent Mare Service returns request emails to 28 breeders and have received only 11 replies.

Microchipping will be mandatory from this season onwards. Freeze branding is still available for those who request it.

Foal Registrations 2022 - the process can be completed via the Foal Registration Form on the website. The fees must be paid via Internet banking as Paypal is no longer available. <https://nzhanoverian.com/forms/foal-registration/>

The following is required for Foal registrations – and it the breeder's responsibility to provide the documents before I can complete registrations.

- Foal Return Form
- Mare Covering Certificate (copy also sent to Semen seller for verification)
- Service Certificate – from the Stallion owner or Semen
- DNA – Parent Verification Report received from Massey
- Fees paid and the process completed within 12 months of foal's date of birth

As requested at the AGM, I have done some research into the cost and complexity of producing the Pink Papers into a plastic cover. It is possible but the costs are not yet resolved. The WBs get their covers from Australia, the bulk of the pages are done into a booklet that slots straight in. However, the Website for their supplier is dysfunctional at this time so I do not know the price. I can source the ID page from Janette Lewis in HHSA, and somehow work out how to print the Pink Papers with a gap in the middle so that when they are

folded to fit into the cover, the whole page is visible. I have emailed Janette to see where they source theirs as an alternative option. This is therefore still work in progress.

The Stallion advert was printed in the digital version of Show Circuit magazine, and it turned out pretty well, with the stallions' status well identified. Sheryll Davies also placed a post of the advert on Facebook last week.

The Tour is covered in a separate document. It will be a busy 10 days for all concerned but the budget is looking healthy at least. Once the Committee has viewed and discussed the draft, I will do a Facebook post for expressions of interest from new breeder possibilities.

I will email Breeding members separately about the Foal registration requirements in full and I will also do an abbreviated version for a Facebook post.

We have made public mention of the fact that Furst Hit EDH B. Victoria Wall has qualified for the WYDHCH in Ermelo. This is a first for NZ breeding, so it is an important outcome for our Studbook and Rheinland in particular. I placed a report on the Hanoverian website about this achievement.

I have been called to question about the application of the Rheinland rules for the various levels of the Studbooks and the purpose of Rheinland of NZWB. The rules that I have been following say that this is definitely possible to accept mares from Warmblood registries. To that end I have sent an email to Maren to ask questions in the hope that I have not been incorrectly applying the rules, and that I can dispel any doubts that have been raised. There has not been a response yet – Maren will be very busy with colt selections and the Championship shows at this time, but I will advise you of the answers when I have them.

The following is required for Foal registrations– and it your responsibility as breeder to provide the documents before I can complete registrations.

- Foal Return Form
- Mare Covering Certificate (copy also sent to Semen seller for verification)
- Service Certificate – from the Stallion owner or Semen
- DNA – Parent Verification Report received from Massey
- Fees paid

The foaling return form must at least contain.

- name and address of the foal's owner/s.
- name and registration number of the foal's dam and sire.
- foaling date.
- colour and markings of the foal.
- the mare owner's signature.
- (And in appropriate cases information about barren mares, stillbirth, or death shortly after birth.)
- The birth of a foal must be reported as soon as possible to the studbook keeper by the mare owner, who completes and signs the foaling return form.

The Mare Covering Certificate must show:

- the full name and full postal address of the mare owner/Stud
- the name and registration number (if known) of the mare and stallion.
- colour and brands of the mare.
- all data concerning covering/insemination/embryo transplant, ICSI-embryos
- In the case of ICSI and embryos, a description of the recipient mare is required at the time of breeding to verify the process
- proof of the covering and sign off with the signature of the stud master or semen Provider

A Service certificate (from the Stallion owner or Semen Agent) can be either scanned and emailed or uploaded onto the Database via the Wufoo forms available on the NZHanoverian.com website (preferably the latter)

A DNA hair sample for foal/s and also for the mare if her DNA is not on record at the laboratory, must be sent to the Laboratory in the envelope provided by The Studbook keeper on it with the Order Number noted on it for processing.

The PVR (Parent Verification Report) must have been received before any foal registration paperwork is distributed.

The owner of the foal will receive the Foal Branding/Microchipping Form from the NZHS, subject to payment of foal registration and DNA fees and receipt of the DNA Parent Verification Report from the EPAGSC Laboratory and a Service Certificate from the Stallion owner or Semen Agent.

A DNA hair sample for foal/s and also for the mare if her DNA is not on record at the laboratory, must be sent to the Laboratory in the envelope provided by The Studbook keeper on it with the Order Number noted on it for processing.

The PVR (Parent Verification Report) must have been received before any foal registration paperwork is distributed.

The owner of the foal will receive **the Foal Branding/Microchipping Form from the NZHS, subject to payment of foal registration and DNA fees and receipt of the DNA Parent Verification Report from the EPAGSC Laboratory and a Service Certificate from the Stallion owner or Semen Agent.**

July 30th, 2022, was a remarkable day for NZHS and the Rheinland Studbook - here since 2014 - to produce a stallion and then to be able to have him licensed in NZ under the new regulations...congratulations to Victoria Wall to have the courage and fortitude to take him to Europe and now to succeed in the qualifying process for the YDH World Championships in Ermelo, Netherlands. The first NZ bred horse ever to achieve this feat. Furst Hit EDH (Furstenball Old. /Sandro Hit Old. / Jazz KWPN.).

We quote Victoria from her social media pages right after the event.

"Yay! I can't quite believe I am saying this, but I am so excited and incredibly proud that Friday and I have qualified and been selected to represent New Zealand at the World Breeding World Championships for Young Horses in Ermelo in September!!!

We achieved MER scores in both our tests at Neu Anspach CDI and we are so very excited to be representing NZ at this incredible event!

If that wasn't exciting enough, he is the first NZ bred horse to qualify for this event, so I am doubly excited as breeder!

He arrived in Germany a bit short on training, and then twice being very sick and needing nearly 8 Weeks off since arriving, it's been a big ask ... but he's stepped up every single time I have askedI am so incredibly proud of him.

I wasn't sure it was doable ... but he's improving so fast, and he tried his heart out this weekend. The last test he felt so wonderful, and it was his best ever.

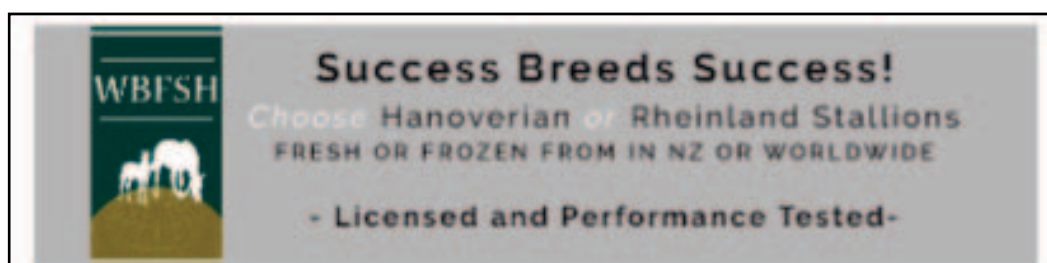

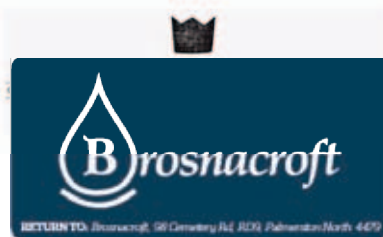
